Eva Anduiza is full professor of Political Science and [ICREA Academia](#) research fellow. In 2009 she founded the research group on [Democracy, Elections and Citizenship](#) which she coordinated until 2023. She was 2018-19 fellow at the [Center for Advanced Study in the Behavioral Sciences](#) at Stanford University. Member of the [Comparative Study of Electoral Systems](#) V Planning Committee (appointed by merit, 2015-2023). She has participated in evaluation panels for different institutions (ERCEA, Finish Akademie, Riksbankens Jubileumsfond, National Science Centre Poland, FCT Portugal). She is the Chair of the



Social Sciences Research Evaluation Committee of the AQU (since 2021) and member of the advisory boards of GESIS and CNES. She has participated in the editorial boards of *European Journal of Political Research*, *Acta Política*, *Política Studies*, *Electoral Studies*.

She has published over **30 peer-reviewed articles** (AJPS, EJPS, EPSR, CPS, IC&S, PolPsy, PolBeh among other outlets), **7 books**, **4 edited books** and **32 book chapters**. Her work has been widely cited (6700 citations in Google Scholar, h index 33, among the 60 most cited scholars in political behavior according to GS). In recent years her research has contributed to the understanding of:

- How sexism and gender backlash are fundamental predictors of [far-right voting](#).
- How [new parties](#) can manage to quickly create party identities that are as meaningful and consequential as the identities with old parties.
- How [polarization](#) changes along the electoral cycle, and hence can be enhanced (and reduced) by the proximity (distance) of elections.
- How populist attitudes are fostered by [anger](#) rather than fear and facilitated by [internal political efficacy](#). How [populist attitudes](#) may work as a motivation for participation that compensates socioeconomic inequalities.
- The different [reasons](#) why people do not always punish [corruption](#) in elections (social [desirability](#) is not one of them).
- The negative consequences of [violent tactics](#) for social movement support, and the long term attitudinal consequences of [protest participation](#).

She has mentored **16 postdoctoral fellows** (including Juan de la Cierva, Beatriu de Pinós, MSCF) and supervised **18 PhD successfully defended dissertations**. She is currently co-directing 3 PhD dissertations. She has been PI of nine national and international research projects and participated in seven more. She is the principal investigator of the **Spanish Political Attitudes Panel**, [POLAT](#), a long-term endeavor currently preparing its 16th wave (2010-2024).

She has received different **prizes and awards**, including two Icrea Academia (2015, 2020) AECPA prize to the best article (2015, 2022) and the best paper (2019), the 2021 GESIS Klingeman Prize, and the 2000 IX Stein Rokkan Prize for Comparative Research in the Social Sciences, ISSC-ECPR.

Part B. CV SUMMARY

1. My research topic is the research system: the set of social, organizational and political structures and processes that influence the production of knowledge. Studying and characterizing the "actors" is important, but what is essential is to analyze their interactions through some key processes. Some of these key processes are career access and promotion, evaluation and research funding, legitimation mechanisms, and organizational reform and adaptation processes. In my projects and throughout over 80 publications, I have made scientific contributions precisely on these connections and interactions between actors within the framework of processes, contributing to the generation of knowledge in various ways. My research has been funded by competitive national and European sources, being the Principal Investigator of 8 research projects and member of the team of more than 25 projects along my whole career.

My findings have called into question the assumption that there are universal criteria or standards for evaluating and determining quality or value. My most recent contributions have delved into the differences by gender and between scientific areas, with important findings related to the interaction with other variables such as quality. My empirical studies have confirmed that there is no significant relationship between mobility (its absence) and scientific productivity in access to a first permanent position in the Spanish university, in the context of retention strategies within internal academic labor markets.



Acknowledging the relevance of the different institutional contexts of research production, I have also contributed to the field with theoretical and empirical research about different types of R&D organizations. I have worked on an institutionalist approach of the adaptation of R&D organizations to their normative and funding environments, based on the degree and type of autonomy that the centers enjoy with respect to the political system, and the researchers within their organizations, the nature individual incentives, and dependence on organizational and collective resources. This has enabled the production of typologies and taxonomies for the empirical testing of the hypotheses. Methodologically, in an area traditionally dominated by descriptive and cross-sectional approaches, I have introduced innovative methodologies and techniques, such as longitudinal event history analysis and field experiments, in order to generate robust knowledge about causal mechanisms.

2. I have continuously worked with international and national R&D institutions and international organizations in advisory and transfer of knowledge roles. I have collaborated as an expert and served in committees of the OECD, the European Commission, as well as with the Spanish Ministry of Science and some Regional Administrations. I have also collaborated with private foundations in issues related to innovation, research HRRR or the contribution universities to development, like the FECYT, the COTEC foundation, the Foundation La Caixa, or the Foundation CyD.

3. I am committed with the training of new generations. I have supervised 4 doctoral dissertations in the last ten years, and supervised the research training of several students in the more than 6 years that I served as Head of the Department of Science and Innovation of the CSIC Institute of Public Goods and Policies. I have also supported some Ramon y Cajal and Juan de la Cierva fellows in my research group, with whom I have collaborated and who are now engaged in successful professional careers in prestigious academic institutions, and in prominent positions within international bodies. I regularly collaborate with public and private funding agencies in the evaluation of grants and projects applications.
